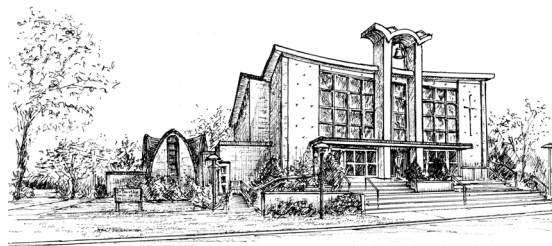

### Adult Initiation

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is an ongoing process of individual faith development and communal formation. Anyone interested in learning more about what it means to become a Catholic Christian, should contact the parish office.

### Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated at scheduled Liturgies. Parishioners who are expecting a child should contact the office at least two months in advance, or as soon as possible to make arrangements and meet with the Baptismal Preparation Team.

### Reconciliation

Also known as “penance” or “confession”, the Sacrament of Penance is regularly available every Saturday at 3:30pm in the church. Individual appointments may also be made with one of the priests. The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated communally during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

### Marriage

Engaged parishioners who are interested in being married at St. Timothy Parish must contact one of the priests at least six months in advance. Call the office regarding Marriage Preparation classes.

### Sacrament of the Sick

Praying for healing in body, mind and soul has always been a part of the Church’s ministry to those who are ill. Anyone who is seriously ill or anticipating hospitalization, may celebrate the Sacrament on Saturdays following the 9am Mass, or upon request.

### Devotion/Prayer Groups

**Rosary** is said Monday through Saturday prior to morning Mass.

The Guild normally meets the first Tuesday of the month, Oct.-May. Rosary begins at 7:30pm (Church); Program at 8pm in the Church Hall.

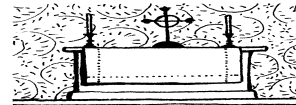
## Question of the Week

“ A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR ”

Dear friends-

Once again, I want to extend to you and to your loved ones my best wishes that God will bless us during this beautiful season of Easter. It is always wonderful to see the church filled for Easter services, and hopefully the sense of hope and joy of the Easter Masses will encourage some of those who attended to join us more regularly in the future.

Thank you too for your generous response to the Easter collection. As you know, that collection, as well as the Christmas collection, goes to support the medical and retirement needs of the senior priests of the Archdiocese. Your response this year was most generous and is deeply appreciated.

The end of April and the beginning of May are busy times here in the parish. On April 29<sup>th</sup> we will celebrate Confirmation for our tenth grade students and on the weekend of May 1 and 2 we share Holy Communion for the first time with our second grade classes.

For many reasons it is a challenge to involve young people in the life of the church today. Life moves at such a fast pace today and is so busy; there is the turmoil in the church that our parents did not have to deal with; our society is so much more complex today than at other times. I'm grateful to our parents who continue to try to involve their children in the church and encourage them to grow in their faith. These are tumultuous times. The church I grew up in is very different than the church I live in today. No doubt, the church will continue to be much more different in the years ahead.

I will say this. In spite of the challenges to faith that we do face today—I continue to remain grateful for the difference the church and my faith have made in my life. Throughout the history of the church, human beings have made mistakes—in some cases grave mistakes. Often, as a result of those mistakes, reforms were instituted which helped bring the church back to its roots. Those reforms were the result of Christ's promise to remain with the church. I hope that we can see the reforms occur in our church today that will bring it back to be a place of true faith, hope, and charity—the type of church Jesus hoped for. I hope that each one of us can try our best to make our parish a place where the presence of Christ is felt, and a place where the young men and women and the children of our parish who are about to receive the Holy Spirit in Confirmation and Jesus in the Holy Eucharist will grow in their knowledge and love of God for many years to come.
