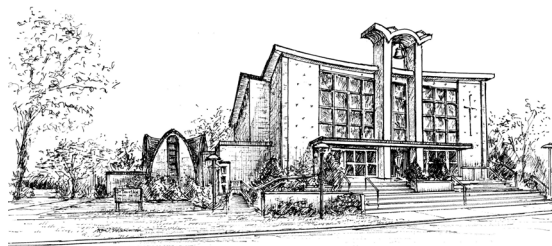

### Adult Initiation

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is an ongoing process of individual faith development and communal formation. Anyone interested in learning more about what it means to become a Catholic Christian, should contact the parish office.

### Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated at scheduled Liturgies. Parishioners who are expecting a child should contact the office at least two months in advance, or as soon as possible to make arrangements and meet with the Baptismal Preparation Team.

### Reconciliation

Also known as “penance” or “confession”, the Sacrament of Penance is regularly available every Saturday at 3:30pm in the church. Individual appointments may also be made with one of the priests. The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated communally during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

### Marriage

Engaged parishioners who are interested in being married at St. Timothy Parish must contact one of the priests at least six months in advance. Call the office regarding Marriage Preparation classes.

### Sacrament of the Sick

Praying for healing in body, mind and soul has always been a part of the Church’s ministry to those who are ill. Anyone who is seriously ill or anticipating hospitalization, may celebrate the Sacrament on Saturdays following the 9am Mass, or upon request.

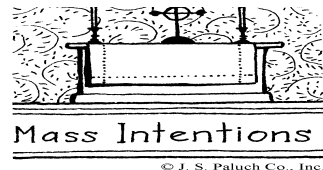
Question of the Week

Question for Children: God fills us with love. How, this week, will you show your family - your mom, dad, brothers, sisters, grandparents, cousins - that you love them as God loves them?

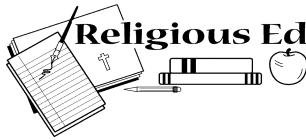

**Saturday, June 5 – 3rd Annual Moyamoya  
Fundraiser**

One of our young parishioners, Justin Doo who is a Walpole resident and 5<sup>th</sup> grader at Fisher School, was diagnosed with Moyamoya disease (“MMD”) in March 2007 when he was just seven years old, following periods of increasingly severe headaches and numbness in his tongue, arms and legs. MMD is a progressive narrowing of the arteries to the brain, which restricts blood flow to the brain, oftentimes resulting in TIAs (transient ischemic attacks or mini-strokes) or even worse, a stroke. This rare disease affects only one in 2,000,000 people, with symptoms usually occurring at around age seven. The only option is brain surgery, which Justin bravely endured for eight hours in April 2007 at Children’s Hospital-Boston at the hands of Dr. Michael Scott. Dr. Scott is one of only two doctors in the world who is most knowledgeable regarding this rare disease.

In support of Justin and MMD, his family will be holding their 3rd MMD fundraiser to raise funds for vital research of disease. The event will take place on Saturday, June 5 at 3 Muskett Lane, Walpole, from 9-3 (rain or shine) and will include a car wash, MMD T-shirts, water bottles & car fresheners, nail & face painting, petting zoo and several raffle items (including area restaurants, sports tickets, hair and nail salons, dry cleaning and more). **All money raised will be donated for MMD research.**

The money raised will help Justin and others like him who will always have MMD. Many questions remain unanswered with MMD. Doctors wonder, is it genetic or environmental? Why does it cause intense migraine-like headaches? Why do children show different symptoms prior to diagnosis? Continued research related to this disease is vital to better diagnose it and treat its patients.

Raising awareness of MMD and fundraising is all the family can do to “help” their little boy. Justin and his family understands all too well the value of life and how one day, everything can change with a phone call.
